EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT:

Overview

Work continues on a review of services and Spheres of Influences for cities, fire protection service providers, and emergency medical service providers. While the information-gathering task continues to take longer than expected, the overall tasks remain substantially on schedule.

Background

State law requires each LAFCO to update Service Reviews and Spheres of Influence for all cities and districts every five years. In April 2009, the Formation Commission approved a comprehensive work program to spread this work out in phases over several years. The work is being done by LAFCO staff, and is funded as part of annual contributions to the general operating expenses of LAFCO.

Discussion

Phase One of the comprehensive work program is underway. It includes all cities, fire protection providers and emergency medical service providers.


Requests for Phase One information were issued in July and August 2009. To date, we have received responses from 9 of 12 cities, 9 of 14 fire protection service providers, and the countywide emergency medical services provider. Attachment 1 details the responses to date. We had anticipated that the information-gathering phase would be done by December, but the remaining agencies need more time to complete the survey.

Meanwhile, we have started to review and analyze the information received, and will soon start one-on-one agency interviews. Our approach is to coordinate closely with agencies in our reviews and environmental determinations.
